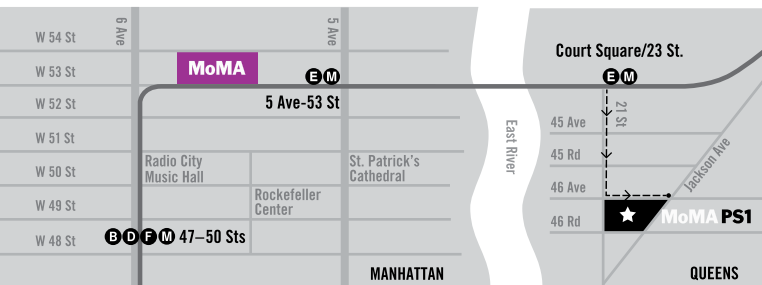

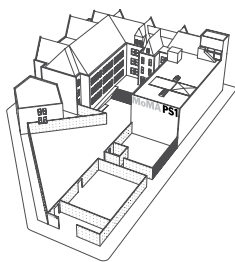

INFORMATION DESKS are located on floors 1 through 5.
MoMA staff and volunteers are happy to answer
questions regarding current exhibitions, Museum
programs, and navigating the building.



MOBILE TOURS feature audio commentaries on the
collection and special exhibitions, plus interactive ways to
learn about artists, artworks, and more. Pick up a mobile
device free of charge on floors 1 or 6 (Photo ID required,
at checkout. Passports and credit cards not accepted.),
use your own handheld device via MoMA's public WiFi
network, or download the free **MoMA APP** at
MoMA.org/mobile.

THE EDUCATION CENTER is open during Museum
hours. Explore interactive spaces for all ages. Enter
through the second floor of the Museum or via the
54 Street entrance. For a schedule of programs or
more information, visit MoMA.org/learn.

FREE WIFI NETWORK is available throughout the
Museum. Go to the settings in your wireless device,
make sure WiFi is on, select MoMA WiFi, and accept
the terms of service to connect.

SELF-GUIDED VISIT

SHORT VISIT

Concentrate on a specific collection area or explore a
special exhibition in depth. Looking for a particular
artist? The floor plan on the reverse side lists some of

Stop by an information desk to help plan your day.



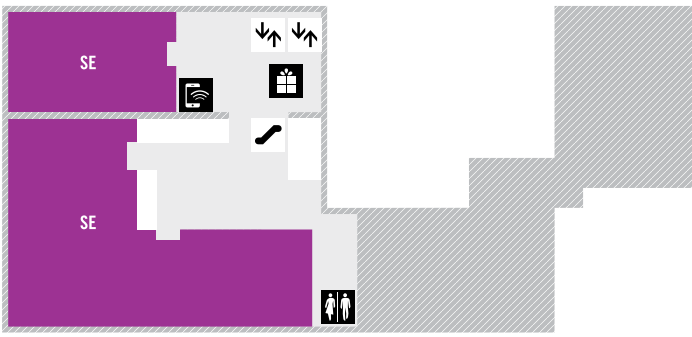
FAMILY VISIT

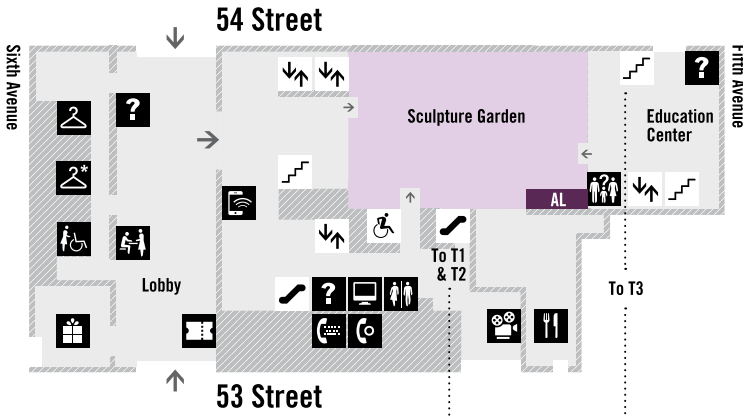

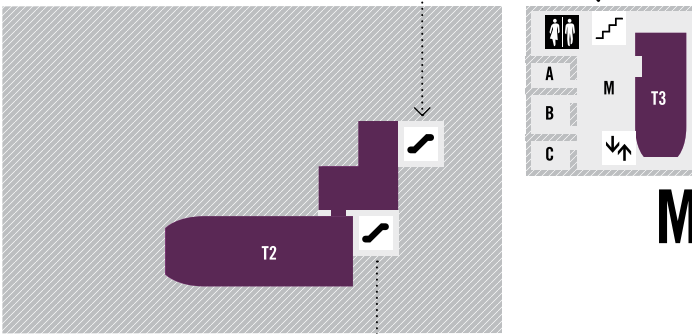

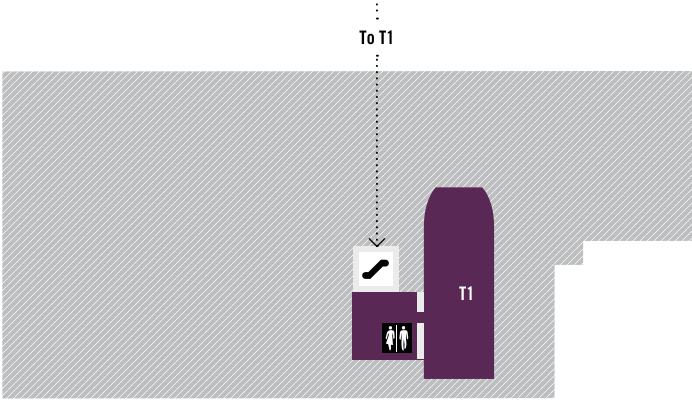

No flash photography or video cameras in the galleries. No tripods. Still photography for personal, noncommercial use is permitted in collection galleries only (no special exhibitions).

Sketching is permitted in the galleries—pencil only, no ink or paint—with sketchbooks no larger than 8 1/2 x 11" (21.6 x 27.9 cm). No easels, stools, or sketching while seated on the floor.

No talking on cell phones in the galleries or theaters.

No smoking in the Museum or Sculpture Garden.

No outside food and drinks in the Museum.

Baby strollers are not permitted on escalators.

All items are subject to security inspection. Items larger than 15" x 11" x 5" (38 x 28 x 13 cm) and large umbrellas must be checked. No items larger than 22" x 14" x 9" (56 x 36 x 23 cm) will be accepted.

All galleries and facilities are wheelchair accessible.

All theaters and Classroom B are equipped with sound-enhancement systems.
